Gulf Breeze Zoo & Botanical Gardens

The wildlife preserve offers glimpses of Gorilla Island, where primates live unhindered in a natural habitat. A ride on the zoo's diminutive train provides views as well. At the Farm, children can interact with tame animals and see how resident newborns are cared for. In addition, visitors will encounter rhinos, giraffes, bears and reptiles. White Bengal tigers, pygmy hippos and zebras also attract the attention of zoo-goers. Adults in particular will appreciate the Japanese gardens and the gift shop, which sells clothing, gifts and artwork.

Okaloosa Island Boardwalk

Lots of people, including military guys and college kids, come to bask in the sun, swim and play volleyball at the numerous local courts. Lifeguards are on duty along the coast, and changing rooms and restrooms can be found on the Boardwalk itself. If the sun gets to be too much, drink machines and snack bars are located nearby.

Grayton Beach State Recreation Area

Located near the community of Grayton Beach, it attracts visitors with its unspoiled beauty and abundant wildlife. Swimming and fishing are the top recreational activities, but campsites are great for overnight stays, and an extensive nature trail directs hikers around dunes and through pine forests. Boating is available on Western Lake.

Emerald Coast Science Center

More than 250 hands-on exhibits allow visitors to learn about robotics, health, and the power and impact of hurricanes. Highlights also include a display on wind and flight and the opportunity to interact with live animals. An on-premises gift shop sells toys and games with a scientific theme and doesn't require a ticket for entrance.

Bustling with activity and peppered with shipwrecks, palm trees and observation areas, the park accommodates both children and adults. Wave pools and water slides are a cool, clean way to splash the day away, or you can test your skills with a putter or a steering wheel. If you're an adrenaline junkie, the selection of thrill rides will more than satisfy your need, and you can compete with your friends to see who shrieks loudest when the games begin!

Its waterside location is a perfect jumping-off place for watersports and cruises of the area. The company rents wave runners and pontoon boats and can also arrange for parasailing adventures for up to three people at a time. Their glass-bottom boat is popular with guests who want to spot dolphins, check out underwater sea life, and see the area's sights and attractions. Rentals can be set up for an hour at a time, full and half-days, and by the week.

Gulfarium

Instituted in 1955, this facility simultaneously educates and entertains visitors while promoting the welfare of marine life. Some venues feature performances by dolphins and sea lions; the Living Sea exhibit showcases turtles, sharks, eels and other animals, giving guests insight into their behavior and interaction. The complex also boasts penguins, otters, alligators and a touch pool where you can experience sea life firsthand. There's even an opportunity (with advance reservations) to swim with Kiwi and Daphne, two of the resident dolphins. The beachside attraction, which has indoor and outdoor displays, is open rain or shine; a gift shop sells clothing and souvenirs.



Built in 1897, the home was refurbished in the 1960s and now sports period antiques and furnishings. The gardens were created at the time of the renovation and feature collections of azaleas, camellias and other flowering shrubs. When the grounds are in bloom each spring, the whole area is a riot of color and fragrance. Picnic tables by the Choctawhatchee River provide a great place to enjoy a simple lunch.

Topsail Hill State Preserve

Freshwater lakes, pine forests, towering sand dunes, and a host of wildlife occupy the area and offer a glimpse of what Florida used to be. Facilities aren't elaborate but do include a parking lot and restrooms; nature trails wind through the site, and campsites can be found nearby (although not in the preserve). The beach itself stretches for more than three miles through the park.

- 6. **Emerald Coast Science Center.** A children's museum, it is an interactive experience that even grownups can enjoy. There are more than 250 exhibits that help children learn about hurricanes, flight, wind, and robots.
- 7. **Visit Gator Beach.** Feed live alligators at Gator Beach. It's not as dangerous as it might sound, but it's awfully exciting.
- 8. **Go on a Dolphin Cruise.** For \$20 per person, take a few hours out of your day and go on a dolphin cruise. The cruises take you into the Gulf for 2 hours and are narrated. There are usually concession stands on-board, too.
- Go fishing. Destin is known for its fishing, so why not try your hand at it? Some fish that
 can be caught in Destin include the Redsnapper, Yellow Fin Grouper, Flounder, King
 Mackerel, Tarpon, Blue Marlin, and Speckled Trout. Just don't forget to get your Florida
 fishing license first.

10. **Pleasure Island Waterpark.** Cool off for a day at the water park. There are also pontoon rentals, go-carts, and wave runners onsite, too.

No matter what your budget is, you will be sure to find something appealing in Destin, Florida. When in doubt, you can always just kick back on the beach and relax in the sun.

However, what does a tourist do when they're not stuffing their pie hole with fried grouper or getting burnt on the beach? Thanks to TripShock!, here is a list of the top ten things to do this summer that really rock!

- **10) Big Kahuna's Water Park** Big Kahuna's Water park is Destin's one and only water park. It's typically open from Memorial day to Labor Day and has a ton of cool slides and rides. It can get crowded during peak season (July and June), but it's worth every dollar if tourists plan their trip on an off day.
- 9) Sailing Charter Hire a sail captain and cruise Destin. Fish, snorkel or just relax in the sun as the sail captain guides tourists through paradise. Although this is not the most inexpensive tour

available, it's well worth it when looking for a way to explore Destin's emerald green waters with close friends or family.

- 8) Snorkeling at the Jetties Snorkeling the Destin Jetties is an exciting and mysterious experience that's great for the entire family. It's tough to tell sometimes what people will see underwater. It can be a dolphin, sea turtle, or even a grumpy old crab. Watch for the pinchers!
- 7) Waverunner Rentals Explore the Destin Harbor and The Choctawatchee Bay while traveling at speeds topping 40 mph. Look for dolphins or ride some waves.
- 6) Pontoon to Crab Island Every weekend during the summer, locals and tourists alike gather at Crab Island which is a sand bar located underneath the Destin Bridge. Rent a pontoon from a local dealer and get ready to have fun! Snorkel, socialize, frisbee, or just lay around and sip a favorite cocktail.
- **5) Kayak Fishing Charter** One of the new and cool things to do in Destin is Kayak Fishing. Hire a guide and go in the gulf or bay for a day of fishing. This is not recommended for small children or beginner anglers, but it's a fun and challenging sport and a great experience.
- **4) Banana Boats** This is for the tourist that is looking for more of a thrill. This is similar to the sport we call "tubing", but the passengers will ride a longer tube that fits up to 6 people. The passengers are pulled behind a boat that is guided around the Choctawhatchee Bay. If the captain is feeling nice, he won't go over any big waves (no promises though).
- 3) Shark Fishing Lucky for us, Jaws doesn't swim around Destin too often, but some large and mean sharks still do. Destin offers shark charters that offer the thrill of catching and releasing big game.
- **2)** Parasailing Don't miss out on the opportunity to fly over 800 feet in the air and see Destin from a bird's eye view. This is an activity that is great for nearly all ages and it's an exciting memory to bring back home.

1) Deep Sea Fishing – Deep sea fishing is the reason why Destin is where it is today. There are several charters available for hire and many of them will fit all budgets one way or another. If a charter is not affordable, go to the pier on Okaloosa Island and rent a fishing pole. It's best to avoid fishing on the beach because the swimmers will give dirty looks. Fishing for human was never on my bucket list anyway!
